### WHAT WE'RE LEARNING...

**Reading:**

We're finishing up our last story from our reading book. We've been working on finding the topic, main idea, and supporting details of a nonfiction text. We will complete an "escape the room" activity and incorporate some summer themed texts into our work.

**Language Arts:**

This month we are working with adverbs and using them to compare. We are also working on analogies and some more suffixes.

**Writing:**

We've been hard at work on our procedural writing and will be creating our board games this month. Once they are finished, we will play each other's games and provide feedback.

**Science:**

This month we are finishing up investigating Earth's resources. We will also be completing a few STEM challenges this month. We will be testing different ways to clean up an oil spill, designing our own tool to clean up an oil spill, and a fun summer themed STEM project.

**Social Studies:**

We've been splitting our time between learning about the West region of the U.S. and working on economics.
